- 1. **Internal Conflicts**: Psychological struggles, fears, doubts, or ethical dilemmas they face.
- 2. **External Conflicts**: Challenges posed by the environment, other characters, or societal expectations.

### **Development Arc**

- 1. **Character Growth**: How they will change throughout the story.
- 2. Challenges for Growth: Specific events that will test them and facilitate their growth.
- 3. **Resolution**: How their internal and external conflicts resolve by the end of the story.

#### Miscellaneous

- 1. **Secrets**: Things only the character (and perhaps the reader) knows.
- 2. Quirks: Unique habits or behaviors that make the character stand out.
- 3. **Fears**: Phobias or deep-seated fears that affect their behavior.
